A group of Rosies and families from Texas and another group of Rosies and families from Oregon are traveling by train and enjoying the 15% discount on fares for senior citizens.

## Convention Travel Tips

If you are traveling by car, there is ample free parking at our hotel. If you travel by Amtrak train, seniors receive a 15% discount. The train station is about 5 miles from our hotel. If you plan to fly, there are two airport choices: Oakland International Airport is the closest (22 miles north of the hotel; a taxi to hotel will cost approximately \$45), or the San Francisco International Airport (40 miles from the hotel; a taxi to hotel will cost approximately \$65). Other possibilities for transportation to the hotel include Bay Porter Express airport shuttle service (www.bayporter.com, 1-877-467-1800) and the Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) train system (www.bart.gov) that has a station about 5 miles from the hotel.

August 14, 2015 marks the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War II. What can **YOU** do on August 14, 15, or 16 in commemoration? Here are a few ideas for starters:

7. Attend a commemorative event put on by a local veterans' organization. (Be sure to wear your bandana and shirt!)
