## Grant Funds Awarded





Notes: Meal reservations received after April 25 and "walk-ins" or those who have not pre-registered will be accepted on a space-available basis. If it is necessary to cancel after sending your registration, requests for reimbursement must reach Julia Unkrich at the above address by May 15.

Embassy Suites provides a free shuttle service from and to the airport.

Hotel information: Special hotel room rates are available at Embassy Suites, Omaha—Downtown/Old Market. The rate is \$139.00 per night plus taxes and fees for 1-2 persons per room, \$154.00 per night for 3 persons, and \$169.00 per night for 4 persons. This includes a full hot breakfast each morning, and a beverages/hors d'oeuvres reception each evening.

Parking at the hotel is \$12 per day for a guest's overnight self-parking, \$18 per day for valet parking.

The special rate will apply for May 28—June 3, for those who want to extend their stay. To be assured of this price, you must make your reservation directly with the hotel by April 25, 2014. After that date, regular hotel rates will prevail on a space-available basis.

# Rosies Will Be Honored In Georgia

Jonnie Clasen, President of ARRA's "Baker's Dozen" Chapter in Columbus, Georgia/Phenix City, Alabama, wants all Rosies to know about a special recognition taking place in April.

The 11th annual WW II Heritage Days will be held

April 26-27, 2014 at Falcon Field in Peachtree City, Georgia. The event will honor the "women of the Greatest Generation." and will include WW II aircraft flying overhead, guest speakers, impersonations of 1940's celebrities, mock battle reenactments, a Hangar dance with a live orchestra, and more. There will also be educational displays by veterans, military enthusiasts, and other organizations, as well as activities for



school age children. For the eighth year, Jonnie and her chapter will be setting up a large Rosie exhibit, as well as an exhibit on Merrill's Marauders. Jonnie's father, Vincent Melillo, 95, is a Rivet and the last original WW II Merrill's Marauder in Georgia.
