Dogwoods in Quincy



Rosie **Bertha Glavin**, President of the Boston, MA Chapter of ARRA, reports that the city of Quincy, MA has planted five pink dogwood trees in honor of Rosies. The trees are near a lovely fountain and a memorial to WW II veterans. As seen in the picture above, they also surround a memorial stone for President John Adams and his son, President John Quincy Adams, whose bodies are at a nearby church in downtown Quincy. A beautiful tribute!

World Record Broken Again!



As of October 24, 2015, the ladies at Willow Run have done it again! On that date, **2,091** Rosies and Rosie look-alikes gathered at the site of the Willow Run Bomber Plant near Ypsilanti, Michigan. About 600 carried with them the story of a real-life Rosie who couldn't be present. Together, they set a new Guinness world record for the Most Rosie the Riveters in one place. Congratulations!

The first world record for Most Rosies (**776**) was set in March, 2014 by ladies in this same area, in an effort to preserve a portion of the historic Willow Run plant, which was the largest factory under one roof in the world, producing 8,600 B-24 Liberator bombers in the war. It will be the new home of the Yankee Air Museum, which includes many Rosie displays.

Fast-forward to August, 2015, when another fabulous group of ladies gathered **1,081** Rosie look-alikes at the Rosie the Riveter Home Front National Historical Park in Richmond, California, to break the record.

Now, the Willow Run ladies have won it back, but they continue to issue the challenge . . . Who will break the record next?? It's a great way to honor our Rosies' legacy!


The social at Ft. Benning was attended by more than

250 people, many in 1940's attire, and was organized by the Columbus, GA/Phenix City, AL ARRA Chapter. Rosebud and Chapter President **Jonnie Melillo Clasen** said **Maj. Gen. Scott Miller**, Ft. Benning commanding general, and **Brig. Gen. Peter L. Jones**, Infantry School commandant, wrote individual letters given to each Rosie and veteran. Jones was also part of the program. The social opened with Franklin D. Roosevelt reenactor, **Dr. Toby Raper** leading the Pledge of Allegiance. A special surprise presentation was made from the Columbus Mayor's office to **Dr. Fran Carter**, ARRA's founder and Executive Director.



Professional storyteller and Rosebud **Carol Cain** portrayed several Rosies in a dramatic presentation. And very special musical performances were given by Rosie **June Midkiff Tinker**, who sang and played the guitar, and 97-year-old Rivet **Vincent Melillo**, Jonnie's father and Georgia's last original WW II Merrill's Marauder, sang and played the bones. It was quite a celebration and tribute to "The Greatest Generation!"

Times Square Kiss Project

On August 14, 2015, an animated video showed repeatedly throughout the day on Walgreen's jumbo screen in Times Square in New York. The video showed thousands of photographs depicting 1940's couples moving to form a mosaic picture of the famous "Kiss" picture from V-J Day.

And good news! The Spirit of '45 coalition will be updating the mosaic annually so it can be shown on the jumbo screen August 14 *each year*, through the year 2020!

If you have already sent a picture, no need to send again. But if not, send in *your* favorite 1940's couple's photograph, following these guidelines: Photos should be from the waist up (no feet and legs). They do not have to be wedding photos. Photos must be scanned at 300 DPI or better, and sent in a file that is close to 1 MB large (not reduced for quicker sending). Label the file with the couple's name, such as "SmithJohnAndMary." Photos should be emailed to couples@spiritof45.org, along with the couple's names, the city they are from, and the year they were married.
