National Rosie the Riveter Day Announced!

It took a few decades, but Rosies everywhere were honored with a National Rosie the Riveter Day when the U. S. Congress passed a resolution in March to declare March 21, 2017 as the day.

Word began to spread, and good wishes and celebrations began to crop up around the country. For starters, some members of Congress who sponsored the resolution held an event in the Lincoln Room of the U.S. Capitol building. In Oregon,

It was a thrilling moment for all Rosies, and no one was more gratified than Rosies Mae Krier of PA (on left, below) and Phyllis Gould of CA (on right). They were "bookends" on opposite sides of the country who worked with their Congressmen for years to push the passage of the

resolution. Mae attended the wonderful event at the U.S. Capitol on March 21, as did another Rosie, Anna Hess from WV, and they were treated like royalty. Phyllis celebrated at the Rosie the Riveter/WW II Home Front National Historical Park



in Richmond, CA, where she serves as a docent. There was a press conference, and Rosies planted a rose bush.

Word may not have reached you in time to celebrate on the exact day this year (though the celebrations continue), and at present, the designation was for the 2017 date only. But hopes are high that it will become a permanent day, so let your Senator or Representative know of your support for that. Many, many congrats to all the Rosies!
