A Super Successful Convention!

Good barbecue, good music—and especially good fun and fellowship—all were in bountiful supply June 9-11, 2017 for the 18th annual Convention of the American Rosie the Riveter Association in Kansas City, Missouri! Thirty original Rosies were present, along with many Rosebuds, Rivets, Friends, and guests, altogether representing 23 states.



These 30 beautiful Rosies were in attendance, along with many family members, representing 23 states.

Following the Executive Board meeting on Friday afternoon, the evening session was opened by the Color Guard from Ft. Leavenworth (KS) Army Installation. Participants then were treated to Rosie music by Heartsong,



an ensemble of the Kansas City Women's Chorus. Pam Sanfilippo, who traveled from the Dwight D. Eisenhower Presidential Library, Museum, and Boyhood Home in Abilene, KS, shared wonderful history about General Eisenhower.

Rounding out the evening were Rosebud 3 Jema Settles (IA) and her friend, Hudson Harris, with their delightful rendition of "Anything You Can Do, I Can Do Better."

Hudson opened the Saturday morning business session with the National Anthem, and the election of officers for 2017-2019 followed (more on page 3). As President Jean Ousley (GA) presided, Chapters and individuals told about their activities-a great way to share ideas! We

welcomed two new Chapters in CT and IN.

Then it was time to board buses and head for the Harry S. Truman Presidential Library and Museum in Independence,



MO, where there was a marvelous BBQ lunch and a presentation by Dr. Dan Desko about the B-25 Project that featured many Kansas City Rosies. This was followed by a



video about KC Rosies and time to tour the museum. Special guests for the afternoon were President and Mrs. Truman—well, reenactors, anyway! A surprise highlight was the presence of the Rosie the Riveter statue by Seward Johnson, which traveled

to Kansas City for the Convention. After stopping by the Truman Home and the soda shop where Truman first worked, the group returned to the hotel. At dinner, everyone enjoyed music by the Abel Ramirez Trio, featuring Frank Vigliaturo, and after dinner, there were several special tributes and presentations.

Jema Settles began the Sunday morning session with the National Anthem, then Rosebud Co-Chaplains Trish Woepking (IA) and Julia Unkrich (CO) led a Memorial

Service. New officers were installed by our Executive Director and founder, Rosie Dr. Fran Carter (AL). Participants discussed the location of next year's Convention, then voted overwhelmingly for New Orleans, LA.

And in between all of these great program pieces, Rosies told their incredible stories, many, many new friends got to know each other, and old friends were reunited. What a fabulous time! See you next year in NOLA!

Game on! The original Guinness World Record for the "Largest Gathering of People Dressed as a Rosie the Riveter" was set by a group at the Yankee Air Museum near Ypsilanti,

MI in 2014. Currently, the record stands at 2,229, which was set by a group at the Rosie the Riveter/WW II Home Front National Historical Park in Richmond, CA in 2016. Both groups are attempting to break the record again soon, and you might want to join them! People of all ages participate-from babies to Rosies in their 90's-but there are very specific dress requirements, so be sure to get the details ahead of time!

New Rosie the Riveter Rose

Have you seen the newly patented Rosie the Riveter Rose? It is a beautiful old-fashioned floribunda, and is orange-gold suffused with pink. Thousands of plants are currently being grown and will be available for planting in early 2018.

Many of you are already



asking, *How can I get one?* The best thing to do is to go to your local nursery *now* and say that you would like to preorder the Rosie the Riveter Rose, grown by Weeks Roses of California. Don't be surprised if they haven't heard of it yet— it is that new! A ballpark price range is \$25-\$30.

Also ask when is the best time to plant roses in your growing zone, and that will determine when the plants will be available. Southern regions of the country may be able to plant as early as January, 2018.

But there's more! The Spirit of '45, one of ARRA's partner organizations based in CA, is dedicated to establishing a network of Rosie the Riveter Memorial Rose Gardens across the country, as a tribute to Rosies. Members of ARRA can be a big part of this effort!

Look around your community to find a location that would be just right for a Rosie rose garden—a park, museum or WW II memorial, botanical garden, senior living community, or perhaps an existing rose garden where you could add a few Rosie the Riveter Roses. Work with owners and community leaders to plant Rosie the Riveter bushes there. Add a weather-resistant plaque that will let people know that this garden is in honor of the millions of women who worked on the WW II home front. You'll have a perfect place to host ceremonies that honor Rosies and their legacy each year, such as on Rosie the Riveter Day.

Spirit of '45 is planning a future website, where you also will be able to register your garden as a location on a U. S. map.

Honor a Deceased Rosie

Many deceased Rosies are enrolled as ARRA members by their families. It may sound strange, but actually, it is a wonderful way to honor your Rosie's legacy. It enters her name and place of work into our database, as a record of her service, and you receive a lovely keepsake certificate.
