## Convention How-To Information

<u>Registration:</u> Mail the form on page 3 with your check, or register online. Meal reservations received after May 11, 2018 and "walk-ins" who have not pre-registered will be accepted on a space-available basis. If you must cancel your registration after sending it in, requests for reimbursement must reach Treasurer Jody Valet at the address on page 3 by <u>May 25, 2018</u>.

<u>Hotel information:</u> Special room rates are available at **Hampton Inn Convention Center**, 1201 Convention Center Blvd, New Orleans, LA 70130. This is a beautifully renovated 1903 warehouse in the historic Warehouse District. The rate for 1-4 persons per room is \$100.00 per night plus taxes and fees, which includes an extensive breakfast with hot items.

To make your hotel reservation, call the hotel directly at (504)566-9990. Be sure to say you are with the American Rosie the Riveter Association. If you want to arrive early or stay late, the same rate is available May 30-June 4 for a *limited number of rooms*, but you must ask for <u>Randall</u> when you call the hotel and make your reservation with him. Don't delay if you want to stay extra nights, as these are on a space-available basis and are filling up quickly.

A credit card will be required to make the reservation and to check in when you arrive at the hotel. To be assured of this special price, you must call by <u>May 1, 2018</u>. After May 1, regular hotel rates will prevail on a space-available basis. Hotel cancellations must be made at least 72 hours in advance to avoid charges.

If you are arriving early or staying late, please note that there is not a restaurant located in the hotel, but several restaurants are within a 2-4 block radius, and the Convention Center, which houses food courts, is across the street. The hotel does have a Snack Shop with frozen microwavable items for sale, and all rooms contain microwave ovens and refrigerators.

<u>Transportation</u>: If driving, please use this address in your GPS to find the hotel: 320 Gaiennie Street, New Orleans, LA 70130. Valet parking for guests who drive is \$39 per night, with in-and-out privileges. There is no self-parking at the hotel. A limited number of public parking lots and decks within a few blocks of the hotel may be available for parking at your own risk. Rates are \$20.00 and up per 24-hour period.

If flying, the New Orleans Louis Armstrong International Airport is approximately 16 miles from the hotel. The New Orleans Super Shuttle transport service is available for \$24.00 per person each way, but reservations must be booked at least 6 hours in advance. The Transportation Center pick-up location is across from Baggage Claim. To make a reservation, you may call (877)546-8788, but discounts are available if you download their mobile app or book online at <a href="https://www.supershuttle.com">www.supershuttle.com</a>. AAA and AARP discounts are also available. A taxi from the airport is approximately \$36.00 for 1-2 people, or \$15.00 per person for 3-6 people. Taxi stands are at the airport, or several taxi companies take reservations. Uber is also available.

If arriving by train, Union Station is approximately 2 miles from the hotel. Taxis and Uber are readily available.
