
from TX gave a fun portrayal of Rosie the Riveter, complete with equipment demonstrations. Another highlight was the Saturday field trip to the WW II Museum, where

The idea for ARRA really started in June, 1997, when my husband, John, and I traveled to Warm Springs, GA to hear a program given by **Carol Cain** (who is now a Rosebud) at Roosevelt's Little White House. On the drive home, I told John that I would love to have a club to support this interest, and he said he would

help. (Of course, he thought I meant a local club in Birmingham!) We publicized a bit and asked area Rosies to meet with us the next June at the same event in Warm Springs. Though the turnout was small, I wrote Bylaws during the fall and enlisted officers. I filed the necessary papers in Birmingham on December 7, 1998, and ARRA was born! Our first convention, in Warm Springs in June 1999, had about 30 people present.
