ARRA Bylaws Amendment

In a recent action, ARRA's Executive Committee passed the following changes to the membership fees of our organization. These are lifetime memberships, paid once.

A <u>Rosie</u> (includes <u>Rosie Volunteers</u>) may join for \$10.00. The family of a deceased Rosie may register her for \$10.00.

A **Rosebud**, the direct female descendant of a Rosie, may join as an Active member for \$20.00.

A <u>Rivet</u>, the husband or direct male descendant of a Rosie, may join as an Auxiliary member for \$20.00.

A <u>21st Century Rosie</u>, a woman who works or is retired from a job that was considered "men's work" before the war, may join as an Auxiliary member for \$30.00.

A <u>Rosebud Friend</u> (female) or <u>Rivet Friend</u> (male) who has no known ancestral connection with a Rosie, but pledges to uphold the mission of ARRA, may join as an Auxiliary member for \$30.00.
