Convention Wrap-up by Rosebud Helen Sullinger (MN)




The 2019 American Rosie the Riveter Convention at the Isle of Capri Hotel in Bettendorf, Iowa June 7-9, was attended by more than 120 members and friends from 22 states, including 23 original Rosies!



After a welcome by President **Donnaleen Lanktree** (MI) on Friday evening, Mayor **Bob Gallagher** announced that June 7, 2019 was Rosie the Riveter Day in Bettendorf. The highlight of the evening was the "Rosies on the Red Carpet" event. Each Rosie was guided through a cheering crowd to the

Red Carpet, where details of her Rosie story were read. Everyone stood, cheered, clapped, and whistled for our rock-star Rosies!



activities, inspiring all to carry the stories of the Rosies forward to schools and communities throughout the nation.

That afternoon, we boarded buses bound for the Celebration Belle riverboat for a Lunch Cruise. It was a beau-



tiful day for a Mississippi River boat cruise, and our Captain gave us some history and pointed out sights along the way. After lunch we went to the Rock Island Arsenal, an active military base, to tour their museum. We were greeted by museum staff, including the ranking officer on base, who gave us information about the Arsenal's history,



dating back to 1863. A special Rosie the Riveter display room told the story of women's contributions during the war. The museum staff accompanied us on a bus tour, pointing out buildings in which munitions were made during the war.

On return to the hotel and after a short rest, the Rosies gathered in the lobby to meet

interested members of the public and media representatives.

Dinner was served to the accompaniment of 1940's music by **Josh Duffee and his Orchestra**. One Rosie danced the jitterbug three times, wearing out her younger partners. The after-dinner program was host-



ed by **Gary Metivier**, local TV host and author, who showed videos of his interviews with Arizona Rosies, interspersed with music by the **North Scott Choir** and the **Settles Sisters**.

The Sunday Memorial Service for Rosies and other members who passed away during the last year was highlighted by comments from many members who spoke about those they knew and their service, both during and after the war. Many had been still active in their local ARRA Chapters. **Donnaleen Lanktree** concluded the convention by reading her original poem, "They Were Rosies."

Congratulations to **Trish Woepking** (IA) and **Julia Unkrich** (CO) for hosting an excellent convention! The 2020 ARRA convention will be in Hyde Park, NY, near the homeplace and Presidential Library of Franklin D. Roosevelt, June 12-14, 2020. Mark your calendars now and watch for more information to come!


Rosie Spirit in IN & MI
