Most rooms have handles in walk-in showers, but please verify if needed. Let the hotel know if you require a roll-in shower to accommodate a wheelchair.

Includes free breakfast, free Wi-Fi, and free parking. Ask to have your room rate extended for additional days before or after the convention if you'd like to stay longer!


