#### Please Note: 2020 Convention How-To Information

**REGISTRATION:** Mail the form on page 3 with your check, or register online. Meal reservations received after May 19, 2020 and "walk-ins" who have not pre-registered can only be accepted on a space-available basis. If you must cancel your registration, requests for reimbursement must reach Gretchen Caulfield at the address on page 3 by **May 27, 2020.** 

HOTEL INFORMATION: Special room rates are available at Comfort Suites Hotel, 835 Route 52, Fishkill, NY 12524. These special prices are assured until May 12, 2020, unless the hotel becomes full. The rate for 1-2 persons per room on Friday and Saturday, starts at \$119.99, plus tax, for a standard double with 2 queen beds or 1 king bed. There is a \$10 fee for each additional third and fourth person, as allowed by the hotel. Suites and rooms accommodating parties of 5 are available. Some rooms have sleeper sofas for additional guests. This room rate includes a free hot breakfast buffet in the hotel.

To make your hotel reservation, call the hotel directly at (845) 765-8668. Be sure to say you are with the American Rosie the Riveter Association. Most guest bathrooms have walk-in showers with multiple grab bars—please verify if needed when booking your room. If you would like special accessibility, such as a roll-in shower to accommodate a wheelchair, please make this request while booking your room. If you wish to extend your stay, the same convention rates are available, based on availability.

A credit card will be required to make the reservation and to check in when you arrive at the hotel. <u>Cancellations must be made before 4:00 p.m.</u>, <u>Eastern time</u>, 7 days prior to arrival, to avoid a cancellation penalty. Reservations cancelled within 7 days of arrival are subject to a one-night cancellation fee. The hotel is 100% smoke-free and pet-free.

This is high season in the Hudson Valley area, so make your hotel reservations ASAP, even if you are only considering going, as rooms are being taken by wedding parties and the hotel may become sold out.

What do I do if Comfort Suites is fully booked? No worries! We have another room block at the adjacent "sister" hotel, only 150 steps away from our Convention hotel. Room rates available until May 11, 2020 while availability lasts. Be sure to mention you are with American Rosie the Riveter Association for the discounted rate! The Quality Inn & Suites has free Continental Breakfast, free parking, and free Wi-Fi.

TRANSPORTATION: If driving, please use this address in your GPS to find the hotel: 835 Route 52, Fishkill, NY 12524. The hotel provides FREE parking. If flying, New York Stewart International Airport is only 13 miles away. Uber and Lyft are available from airport to hotel, with an estimated cost of \$21-28 per car. Traffic is a variable for this estimate.

Walkway over the Hudson, Poughkeepsie, NY <a href="https://walkway.org/">https://walkway.org/</a> The world's longest, elevated pedestrian bridge, 212 feet above the Hudson River and 1.28 miles long. 15 miles from hotel.

Washington's Headquarters State Historic Site, Newburgh, NY <a href="https://parks.ny.gov/historic-sites/17/details.aspx">https://parks.ny.gov/historic-sites/17/details.aspx</a>. It was here that George Washington spent critical months and rejected the idea of an American monarchy. 9 miles from hotel.

United States Military Academy West Point Visitor Center, West Point, NY <a href="https://home.army.mil/westpoint/index.php/about/visitor-information">https://home.army.mil/westpoint/index.php/about/visitor-information</a> Identification is required. 22 miles from hotel.

#### Michigan On the Move




