## Sharing the Rosie Legacy

### Rosie the Riveter Congressional Gold Medal Act Passed in the Senate!



Bill S.892 passed in the Senate on November 12, 2020! The bill is to “collectively award the Congressional Gold Medal to the women in the United States who joined the workforce during World War II, providing the aircraft, vehicles, weaponry, ammunition, and other materials to win the war,” referred to as “Rosie the Riveter.” Each Rosie will not be awarded an individual Gold Medal, but it is a collective award to be proud of. The House bill already passed in November 2019 with 293 co-sponsors, and the Senate bill passed with 76 co-sponsors. The next step is onto the President’s desk for his signature!

### Cheboygan & Emmet Counties, MI Chapter Going Strong!

The chapter stayed busy with their planning meetings aboard the historic US Coast Guard Cutter *Mackinaw*! The season’s activities included a moving Ring-a-Bell for Rosie celebration on Labor Day, September 7 (*see p.3*), participating in the Annual Vintage Bike Ride around legendary Mackinac Island on September 13, and placing adorable “Rosie” scarecrows around Mackinaw City for the month of October. In addition, on August 18, they costumed up in honor of the suffragettes and the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th amendment giving women the vote, as they knew that “Rosie” would have been proud of her forbears. ## Connecticut Chapter News

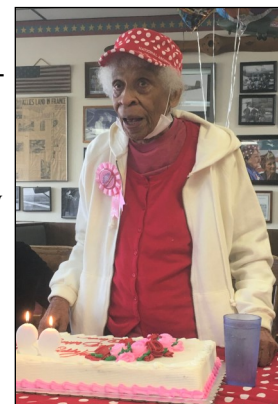

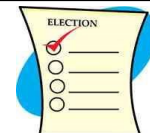

# Rosie in the Magic Kingdom

Rosie Eleanor Stark , 96, of Georgia (pictured right) was a “rock star” during her late October trip to Disney World! Eleanor had her own trailer and “Rosie golf cart” at the facility’s Fort Wilderness campground, and was constantly stopped by people wanting photos or presenting her with gifts. She walked anywhere from 5-10 miles per day and rode several thrill rides. Eleanor was up early every morning for a full day at Disney, saying, “I don’t want to miss a thing. I can rest when I get home!” (When she’s home, she walks her dog a mile every day.) Eleanor is still waiting for her husband, Luther “Buck” Bagley to come home. Buck was KIA in Burma July 25, 1944, and the Army is still searching for his remains.



## U.S. Department of Labor Honors Rosies!

The U.S. Department of Labor collectively honored all World War II women home front workers when they inducted these workers, popularly known as “Rosie the Riveters,” into their Hall of Honor on September 10, 2020. In a special video ceremony, Rosie **June Robbins** (PA) accepted the honor on behalf of all the Rosies, joined by several Rosies via video, including our own **Dr. Fran Carter** (AL), ARRA Founder. “I am proud to announce that the Department of Labor will honor and celebrate the ‘Rosies’, women who helped our nation win World War II and changed the way our country thinks about women in the workplace. By inducting the Rosies, we recognize the contributions they made and the changes they inspired,” said U.S. Secretary of Labor, **Eugene Scalia**. Said First Lady **Melania Trump**, “Rosies, Today we thank you and congratulate you on this well-deserved honor.”

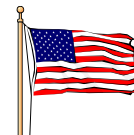

## Rosies Rally Round the Troops!



### SEND OUR TROOPS WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT LIKE ROSIE DID!

ARRA is continuing the long tradition of “*Rosies Rally ‘Round the Troops,*” a letter-writing project that you can do on your own or as a group project! Rosebud **Linda Wallace** is the ARRA National Chair and is coordinating an ARRA nationwide operation to collect your personal letters supporting our Service Members and New Recruits that will be included in the care packages sent out by Operation Gratitude.

Here are the guidelines for writing your letters:

- Start with a generic salutation, such as “Dear Hero” or “Dear Brave One.”
- Express your thanks for their selfless service.
- Avoid politics completely and religion in excess; however, saying you will pray for them is wonderful.
- Share a little about yourself: Family, Hobbies, Work, School, Pets, Travel, etc.
- Talk about life and interests: Your Community, Sports, Weather, Music, Movies, Food, Books, etc.
- Adults: You may include your contact information (mail or email) so the letter recipient can reply. (Recipients may or may not write back; please do not be disappointed if you do not receive a response.)
