- 7. Why did she work at that company/volunteer job?
- 8. Did she apply to a company with a relative or friend?
- 9. What shift did she work?
- 10. How did she get her job and why?
- 11. Provide a job description, training involved, or any kind of information about her job.
- 12. If she worked on a vessel or plane, what part did she work on?
- 13. Can she describe a typical day or share any stories about working.
- 14. Does she remember any amusing stories while working?
- 15. What did she wear?
- 16. Who did she work with (as a team, with a partner)?
- 17. Were there other women working with her?
- 18. Does she remember what she did with her first paycheck?
- 19. Did she have to move for her job (from where)?
- 20. Where did she live when working?
- 21. Describe the living arrangements.
- 22. How did she get to work (bus, walking, carpool)? How long did it take?
- 23. How did she meet her husband? What was her husband's name? And where was he from?
- 24. What did she do with her free time? (evenings or weekends)
- 25. Were there any family members who also worked at a war plant?
- 26. Were there family members who were in the service during the War? Did she know what branch of the military they were in and where stationed/deployed?

- 40. Did she work after WWII? Doing what?
