Fran Carter 1922—2021

On May 31, 2021, Rosie Dr. Fran Carter, EdD, the founder and Executive Director of ARRA, passed away, or as she liked to say about John, her dear husband of almost 68 years, "God called her to heaven." Anyone who knew Fran knows that she expected to live every minute of life, and she did just that for 99 years.

After growing up in a tiny community in rural Mississippi, Fran was a sophomore in college when Pearl Harbor was bombed. Very soon, she was doing her part for the war effort, working as a riveter on B-29's. She didn't know it then, but

many years later, in 1998, her wartime experiences would inspire in her an idea that would resonate in a huge way—to start an organization to honor the working women of World War II and preserve their legacy.

> John said he would help her with her idea—of course, he thought she meant a small club in

> their home town of Birmingham, AL, but Fran had larger plans! Soon the national American Rosie the Riveter Association was born. (And John still helped!) Today, our organization has 7,000+ members. Fran has said many times how proud she is that the next generations are continuing to carry on.

Fran and John also began to give speeches called "Rosie and Her Paratrooper." John wore his original paratrooper uniform, and Fran wore coveralls similar to what she wore as a riveter. And almost immediately, she encouraged Rosies to start writing their stories. She led the new organization to gather and publish ARRA's

first book of 100 Rosie stories by 2001. Six more books have followed. Another great love of Fran's was encouraging museums to display Rosie memorabilia and information. And always, always, encouraging people to join ARRA. "Look in your family tree!" she would say to everyone she met. "Ask somebody, who is the Rosie in your family? Now join for her and all her descendants!"

But Fran "lived every minute" in the 76 years before she started ARRA, too. She and John had two children, 7 grandchildren, and 16 great-grands. She taught elementary school through college, with 27 years as a Professor of Education at Samford University in Birmingham. She wrote children's curriculum materials for her denomination for many years, and published two children's books, including R is for Rosie

the Riveter. Always enjoying "club work," she was national Executive Director of Kappa Delta Epsilon education fraternity and national President of the National League of American Pen Women. She and John were in Civil Air Patrol for 25 years, both reaching the rank of Lt Col. They served in the AL Silver-Haired Legislature and in Fran receiving an award in 1975 the U. S. Silver-Haired Congress.



Fran's faith was always important to her. She started teaching Sunday School at age 12, and continued to do so through age 90. She and John supported many missionary causes throughout the world, and led or participated in more than 15 short-tem mission trips to China, Russia, Indonesia,

and Honduras, including leading teams of teachers to teach monthlong workshops in China for several years, and going on medical/ dental mission trips to Honduras well into their 80's. They supplied thousands of English-language books to overseas schools, and taught for a semester at both Anhui Normal University in Wuhu, China and Hong Kong Baptist University.

We celebrate Fran for all the ways she lived every minute!

From Our Outgoing President

Greetings! It's hard to believe that it was two years ago when we gathered for a fantastic convention in Bettendorf, IA and I became your President—how time flies! Now my 2019-2021 term is

ending, and this is my last newsletter message to you as President. Even with the challenges of the pandemic, we have accomplished so much together as an organization in these two years.

The ARRA insignia jewelry collection was created and is now available through Hamilton Jewelers (see p. 4). New grants were developed for Chapter projects and newly formed Chapters, as well as new education library grants. A Free Rosie Membership campaign was created (see p. 8). We increased our membership by over 10%. Thousands of letters have been sent to our troops through our "Rosies Rally 'Round the Troops" campaign. Members sewed and donated cloth masks to military service members through ARRA's "We Can Sew It" project. Custom-designed ARRA Rosie products were added to the Rosie Shoppe. Our website now features "This Month in History." We celebrated the 75th anniversary of the end of WWII with memories from Rosies in our newsletter. And most importantly, our nation's WWII Rosies were collectively honored twice, first in September 2020 as the U.S. Department of Labor's Women's Bureau inducted "Rosie the Riveter" into their Hall of Honor. Then in December 2020, the Rosie the Riveter Congressional Gold Medal Act was signed into law, recognizing Rosies' historic contribution during WWII.

I am proud that a seventh book of 100 Rosie biographies was published this year. I encourage you to continue to send in your stories and preserve Rosie history for ARRA's Digital Archives and perhaps for an eighth book one day! Then Mabel was elected as Treasurer and served from 2005—2011. From 2011—2015, she served as ARRA's Vice President for Membership. Among other things, she tirelessly researched and contacted newspapers large and small, systematically rotating through regions of the country, sending articles about ARRA, resulting in hundreds and hundreds of ARRA memberships.

Then Mabel served as our Corresponding Secretary from 2015—2021.
