## 2023 Convention How-To Information

CONVENTION REGISTRATION: You may either mail the form on page 3 with your check, OR register online at www.rosietheriveter.net. Registrations received after May 10, 2023 and "walk-ins" who have not pre-registered can only be accepted on a space-available basis. If you must cancel your registration, requests for reimbursement must reach Stephanie Davis at the address on page 3 by May 27, 2023.

HOTEL INFORMATION: Special room rates are available at the hotel, the Portland Marriott Downtown Waterfront, 1401 SW Naito Parkway, Portland, OR 97201. Reservations can be made now at this dedicated web address: https://book.passkey.com/go/RTRC6823, or by calling 1-800-546-9513. Cancellations require 72 hours notice.

Be sure to say you are with the American Rosie the Riveter Association Convention to get the special ARRA rate of \$179 per night, plus taxes and fees. This rate will apply to Thursday night, June 8, 2023 through Monday night, June 12, 2023.

The hotel has a limited number of accessible rooms. If you need an accessible room, make your reservation early, and be sure to state that you need one.

Please note that hotel rooms in the area fill up very quickly for the Portland Rose Festival weekend, so make your hotel reservation now, even if you are still in the process of making all your travel plans.

**TRANSPORTATION:** The hotel does not operate a shuttle from the airport. However, taxis are available for around \$45.00. Lyft and Uber ride-share services are also available. If you are driving, valet parking is available at the hotel, with unlimited come-and-go access during the day, for \$49 per day. Self-parking options are available within a block of the hotel for \$29 and up, but require that you pay each time you enter.

Timberline Lodge at Mt. Hood is one of Oregon's most popular tourist attractions, and was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1977. The WPA (Works Progress Administration) and CCC (Civilian Conservation Corps) funded the majority of Timberline's construction. www.timberlinelodge.com

Pittock Mansion historic house museum was built in 1914 and contains 23 rooms full of rich history. Enjoy views of mountains, forests, downtown Portland, and the river. www.pittockmansion.org

Powell's City of Books has grown from humble beginnings to an iconic Portland destination. To qualify for one of our \$100 grants, a student in grades 6-12 must prepare and present at least *twice* an original, factual presentation about Rosies, such as for a school assignment, a National History Day project, a civic or senior group, a homeschool presenta-

tion, or other gathering. The presentation can be about a specific Rosie, such as a family member, or about Rosies in general. Creative methods (*original* slide shows or videos, displays, skits, etc.) should be used. Both girls and boys are eligible to enter.

# Rosies Take Part in Pearl Harbor Remembrances




At the invitation of our Honolulu (HI) Chapter, five Rosies from four states took part in Pearl Harbor remembrance events, culminating with the Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade on December 7. Many friends and Rosies to a variety of

family members accompanied the Rosies to a variety of events leading up to December 7.

Rosies Marian Sousa and Marian Wynn from CA arrived in time to attend Pacific Aviation's Gala event. Rosie Louise Unkrich from IA joined them for a meet-and-greet event at the Arizona Memorial Visitor's Center, where they met many interested people, signed posters, and shared stories. Rosies Delphine Kalput from MI and Cille MacDonald from HI joined the group for a memorial at the USS Utah.

On December 7, all took part in the Memorial Service at the Arizona Memorial (which started at 6:30 a.m. sharp!). The veterans and Rosies were seated at the front, with approximately 2,500 people in attendance to honor those who lost their lives during the Pearl Harbor bombing of 1941. 


