2024 Convention How-To Information

<u>CONVENTION REGISTRATION:</u> You may either mail the form on page 3 with your check, <u>OR</u> register online at <u>www.rosietheriveter.net</u>. Registrations received after <u>May 24, 2024</u> and "walk-ins" who have not pre-registered can only be accepted on a space-available basis. If you must cancel your registration, requests for reimbursement must reach Stephanie Davis at the address on page 3 by <u>May 30, 2024.</u>

<u>HOTEL INFORMATION:</u> Special room rates are available at the hotel, **The Inn at Opryland,** 2401 Music Valley Drive, Nashville, TN 37214. Reservations can be made <u>now</u> by calling 1-800-901-4211, or at this reservation link: https://www.marriott.com/event-reservations/reservation-link.mi?id=1705955904350&key=GRP&app=resvlink. You must say you are with the American Rosie the Riveter Association Reunion. A credit card is required to hold the reservation.

The deadline to claim the special hotel room rate is May 14, 2024. The rate for an exterior room is \$164 plus tax per night. The rate for an interior room is \$184 plus tax per night. The special rate applies to all nights from Tuesday, June 11 through Tuesday, June 18, based on availability, so plan to come early and stay late to explore Nashville! If you need an accessible room, make your reservation early, and be sure to state that you need one.

Cancelling your hotel room requires 72 hours notice prior to arrival. Cancellations with less than 72 hours notice will mean forfeiting payment for one night's room and tax.

Make your hotel reservation as soon as possible, to avoid our "special rate block" selling out. However, if you do receive a "sold out" message, contact Convention Chair **Laurie Ranta** at TnRantaRosebud@gmail.com or (615) 945-1879.

<u>TRANSPORTATION:</u> The hotel **does not** operate a shuttle from the airport. However, taxis, Lyft and Uber ride-share services are available. If you are driving, there is free self-parking at the hotel. The hotel does offer complimentary shuttle service on a continuous loop between our hotel, the Gaylord Opryland Resort, and the Opry Mills Mall.
