2025 Convention How-To Information

<u>CONVENTION REGISTRATION:</u> You may either mail the form on page 3 with your check, <u>OR</u> register online at <u>www.rosietheriveter.net</u> under the "Convention" tab. Convention registration is separate from hotel registration. Early-bird pricing is available for *convention* registration if postmarked or received online by **May 6**, **2025**. Registrations received after May 6 and "walk -ins" who have not pre-registered can only be accepted on a space-available basis. If you must cancel your registration, requests for reimbursement must reach Laura Wright at the address on page 3 by **May 23**, **2025**.

HOTEL INFORMATION: Special room rates are available at the Hilton Garden Inn Dayton South-Austin Landing, 12000 Innovation Drive, Miamisburg, OH 45342. All convention activities will be at this hotel, with the exception of Saturday's lunch/tour/Rosie-Meet-and-Greet (see page 1). The cutoff deadline to make your hotel reservation and take advantage of the special convention rate is May 1, 2025. Be sure to say you are with the American Rosie the Riveter Association Convention to get the special ARRA rate of \$164 per night, plus taxes and fees, for 1 king bed or 2 queen beds. This rate will apply to June 4 through June 10. Reservations can be made *now* at this link:

The hotel has a limited number of accessible rooms. If you need an accessible room, make your reservation early, and be sure to state that you need one.

TRANSPORTATION: The hotel does not operate a shuttle from the airport. However, taxis (such as Dayton Express Cab Company) are available, as well as Lyft and Uber ride-share services. If you are driving, parking at the hotel is free.

EXTENDING YOUR STAY: There are lots of great things to do in Dayton! The Hilton Garden Inn is offering the special ARRA room rate from June 4 through June 10, so check out historical sites like America's Packard Museum, Carillon Historical Park, Carriage Hill Metro Park, and the Wright Cycle Company Complex, where the Wright Brothers had their bicycle shop. Enjoy the Dayton Art Institute, the Boonshoft Museum of Discovery, or the Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum. Take in a show at the Shuster Performing Arts Center, or explore unique neighborhoods such as the 42nd Street Market or the Oregon District.

Deadline Approaching for ARRA Student Grants

She was 19 and a young mother when her husband was reported Killed In Action in Burma in 1944.
