## **Awesome Convention Days in Dayton!**

On June 6-8, ARRA members and guests gathered at the Hilton Garden Inn, Austin Landing in Dayton, OH for our annual convention. Six WWII Rosies, along with Rosebuds, Rivets, Friends of Rosies, 21st Century Rosies, and guests, all representing 21 states, had a marvelous time as they met old friends and new friends, explored ways to preserve the Rosie legacy, and participated in the myriad of activities prepared by our creative and energetic convention Chairman, Rosebud Bette Kenward (MI). abounded, from the opening greetings to the closing gavel.

Rosies jumped right in with local media interviews on Friday afternoon while ARRA's Executive Board met. Then the festivities really began with a Welcome Dinner on Friday evening. "Eleanor Roosevelt," aka Rosebud Wendy Zielen (MI), gave an enchanting presentation, and Rosebud sisters Ann Marie Miller (MD) and Margie Streicker (MD) led a sing-along and performed 1940s classics, including everyone's favorite, the "Rosie the Riveter" song.

Saturday morning's breakfast featured a special seating area for Rosies and their plus-ones, for a great time of reminiscing and comparing notes. To open the ARRA business session, the colors were presented and Rosebud Jema Settles (IA) shared a beautiful rendition of our national anthem. Even the business session was packed with ideas from around the country!

The group made their way to the National Air Force

Museum to enjoy a delicious lunch, surrounded by aircraft from the Cold War era. First Lieutenant Mackenzie G. Collins, USAF, presented a custom-designed special, challenge coin to each of the Rosies. There was time to tour the museum, then a major highlight was the Rosie Meet-and-Greet in the WWII area. The public lined up in droves to meet our beautiful Rosies and secure autographs and selfies.

Saturday evening was capped off with a Red Carpet Banquet. Each Rosie was escorted into the banquet room while information

about her was read. After a delicious dinner, the dancing began, with fabulous live music brought by Take Flight.

On Sunday morning, new officers for 2025-2027 were elected (see page 3). The grandmother/granddaughter team of Rosebuds Trish Woepking (IA) and Jema Settles (IA) led a White Rose Memorial Ceremony honoring Rosies and other members who had passed away during the previous year. The Convention adjourned and the newly-elected officers began their work immediately with their first Executive Committee meeting of the new term.

ARRA is pleased to announce that ninth-grader **Briar L.** (CT) has been awarded a 2025 ARRA Student Grant! Grant recipients must prepare and present at least twice an original presentation about Rosies. Briar's project honored WWII



contributions of women specific to her town. First, she worked with the town's Parks Department, Historical Society, and local veteran's groups to secure a location and plant a garden of Rosie the Riveter roses with a commemorative plaque. She created a brochure about the town's

Rosies and their workplaces and her presentation included an interview-style recording. Briar also presented for a Girl Scouts Women in Government event, co-hosted by the League of Women Voters, in which she displayed a presentation board, provided her brochure, spoke to 60-70 people present, and involved the girls in a button-sewing activity that related to a local factory in which Rosies made uniforms. 

- 1. Order some free ARRA brochures and bookmarks from <u>presidentARRA@rosietheriveter.net</u> to take with you everywhere. Keep your antennae up to meet women (or their family members) who worked on the WWII home front, for pay or as a volunteer. Give them a brochure and encourage them to join.
- 2. Arrange some pomp and circumstance to present the Rosie with her membership certificate when it arrives—anything from a simple balloon or flowers, to a party for friends and

family, to inviting the mayor, city council, and local media.

- 3. Consider presenting each Rosie with a replica of the Rosies' Congressional Gold Medal (see p. 2). It's newsworthy!
- 4. Accelerate your search by placing a community service announcement in local newspapers/TV/radio and on social media, announcing that ARRA wants to honor women who worked as Rosies in WWII. Provide your contact info.

present and honored. Above, Chapter Secretary Trixie **Lovett** greets a Rosie. On June 6, the Chapter participat-



## Preserving Rosie's Legacy in IN

Rosebud **Jackie Harding**, ARRA's State Director for Indiana, has been busy honoring groups in her state who honor Rosies. On March 21, she presented an ARRA Certificate of Historical Preservation to the Piankeshaw Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution to recognize their annual remem-

brance of Rosie the Riveter Day at Ashland Park on the banks of the Ohio River in Clarksville. The gathering takes place around the Rosie statue erected in memory of Rosie Rose Will Monroe. Pictured at right is Jackie (on right) with Shannon Carter, DAR Chapter Regent.

At this year's game, Jackie took the field to recognize the fabulous efforts that preserve the memory of these women at each game and throughout the park.
